REQUIREMENTS FOR POSITION:

- Completed two semesters of post-secondary education, preferably in earth or biological sciences or a related field, and is planning on continuing their education the upcoming semester,
- Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee status has been conferred,
- Valid driver's license,
- Legally entitled to work according to the relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations,
- Agrees to submit to a criminal background check.

PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Is enthusiastic about learning new information,
- Enjoys working with children, groups of children, and school groups,
- Is comfortable in an outdoor wilderness setting in northeastern British Columbia,
- Can hike on uneven and steep-graded terrain for 3 km
- Has strong public speaking skills, or is looking to develop strong public speaking skills,
- Is interested in learning more about natural history, paleontology, earth sciences, or museum studies.

DUTIES INCLUDE:

- Effectively communicate science-based information on dinosaurs and other fossil organisms found in the Peace Region to children aged 7 – 13 using talks, group activities, games, hands-on activities, field trips, etc.,
- Effectively communicate science-based information on local nature such as birds, freshwater ponds, mammals, trees and plants found in the Peace Region to children aged 7 – 13,
- Schedule and take bookings for Dinosaur Day Camps and Northern Wilderness Camps,
- Plan events for daily Drop-In activities,
- Be comfortable and confident leading and educating children in an outdoors setting, including leading school groups and Education Camp participants to dinosaur trackway sites,
- Direct and supervise activities for school groups from diverse educational facilities (public schools, private schools, homeschools, etc.),
- Maintain cleanliness and accessible condition of the Education Room,
- Participate in developing and refining Education Program activities.
