- Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee status has been conferred,
- Valid driver's license,
- Legally entitled to work according to the relevant provincial/territorial legislation and regulations.

PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Is enthusiastic about learning new information,
- is comfortable in an outdoor wilderness setting in northeastern British Columbia,
- can hike on uneven and steep-graded terrain for 3 km
- has strong public speaking skills, or is looking to develop strong public speaking skills,
- is interested in learning more about natural history, paleontology, earth sciences, or museum studies.
- reliable access to a vehicle preferred (kilometer reimbursement).

DUTIES INCLUDE:

- Learning about regional fossil heritage finds, fossil heritage laws in regards to answering visitor questions, as well as answer basic dinosaur and fossil questions as they relate to the fossil displays,
- Manage Dinosaur Trackway Tour bookings and taking payments,
- Lead dinosaur trackway tours for groups of various sizes, including large tour groups and school groups,
- Maintain and monitor cleanliness, accessibility, and physical condition of hiking trails and dinosaur trackways,
- Learn and deliver information on local wildlife and plant life associated with the dinosaur track sites
- Develop new tour materials for future tour sites.
